




Demographic of the survey respondents

Sample size: 85 participants




Question 1

Starting January 2018, all Ontario children and youth under the age of 25 will have free access to prescription drugs. Do you believe this action will help Ontario families and improve health outcomes for children and youth?




Question 2

The 2017 Ontario Budget includes a number of plans to help seniors stay healthy and active, including a new public transit tax credit for seniors, a new Ontario Caregiver tax credit and a new provincial Dementia Strategy with \$100 million in funding over three years. Do you believe these plans will benefit seniors across Ontario?




Question 3

Post-secondary education is a must for youth to succeed in today's technology driven world. Starting in September 2017, the Government of Ontario will provide free tuition for students, including mature students and adult learners, whose families earn less than \$50,000 a year, or if the student is a single person family and earns less than \$30,000 a year. Do you believe the Ontario Government should ensure young and mature students have access to post-secondary education?



Question 4

Recently, the Ontario government introduced a plan with 16 measures to protect renters and promote affordable housing in the Greater Toronto Hamilton Area. These include rent control for properties built after 1991, a new Non-Resident Speculation Tax and the offering of provincially-owned land worth \$100 million to build affordable housing units. Do you believe this plan will benefit people across Ontario, you, and your family?
