The Ontario government is calling on communities and grassroots organizations in Scarborough-Guildwood to become Great Lakes Guardians and apply for grants of up to \$25,000 to help protect and enhance the Great Lakes.

The <u>Great Lakes Guardian Community Fund</u> provides grants to community groups for grassroots activities such as cleaning up a beach or shoreline or restoring a wetland. Not-for-profit organizations such as youth, environmental and Aboriginal groups are eligible to apply.

Protecting and restoring the Great Lakes is part of the Ontario government's plan to enhance quality of life for Ontario families and ensure a strong, green economy for future generations.
